P.E.

Homework

Purple Mash will be used to set online homework. This will vary across maths, including times-tables, English, including comprehensions, and other various subject skills. To limit objects being carried in and out of school I will not be setting a topic-based homework this term, but hope to change that in the terms moving forwards.

Reading

Children are encouraged to read every day. Please ensure they read a variety of genres and read aloud to an adult at least twice a week for ten minutes. The ability to read aloud and to an audience is an important skill. Also, reading out loud ensures the pronunciation, and understanding, of words is supported as well as the development of using emphasis and tome to share emotion.

This term we are focussing our topic around **Crime and Punishment** during the time period of Roman occupation of Britain to present day.
