Being a Good Digital Citizen



Lesson plan

Lesson Activity:

Being a good digital citizen

Learning Outcomes:

- What is a citizen/digital citizen?
- What is cyberbullying?
- How to counter cyberbullying
- How to be a good digital citizen

Lesson Preparation:

- Download PDF Worksheet Activity 1: Venn diagram good citizens and good digital citizens.
- Photocopy enough for the whole class, individually, in pairs or groups as you feel fit
- Set Cyberbullying Joe's Story up as a PowerPoint
- Download PDF Worksheet Activity 2: What does a good digital citizen do?
- Photocopy enough for groups.

Starter Activity

What is a good digital citizen?

Ask pupils if they know what a citizen is (a person who lives in a particular place, gets the benefits of that place, and who has to abide by its laws and expectations of behaviour) Give examples of being a UK citizen – right to education, healthcare, protection by police, but we also have to uphold the law and behave as 'good citizens'. This includes treating people with respect and not bullying.

Ask pupils if they know what a 'digital citizen' is? (Digital citizenship can be defined as the norms of appropriate, responsible behaviour with regard to technology use.)

Pupil Activities

Activity 1: Venn diagram good citizens and good digital citizens

Hand out Worksheet Activity 1 Venn diagrams for the pupils to fill in – decide whether they are better doing this individually or in groups. Can they think of any other ways to be good citizens/digital citizens/both? Share any other ideas as a class.

The answers are:

Good citizens	Good digital citizens	Both
pick up litter	report inappropriate online behaviour	care for the environment
volunteer	protect online profiles	keep safe
recycle	be aware of digital footprints	are polite
do nice things for others		are responsible
		respect the law
		say no to bullying
		keep others safe

Main Activity

Powerpoint Cyberbullying – Joe's story

Using the Powerpoint tell the story of Joe, asking questions as you go. Emphasise the golden rules at the end.

Pupil Activities

Activity 2: What does a good digital citizen do?

Hand out Worksheet Activity 2 What does a good digital citizen do? In groups, pupils look at the subjects in the boxes. Using what they have learned, decide how a good digital citizen should behave and fill in the boxes. Then, they move to other groups to 'teach', swap ideas and discuss their answers with them.

Possible answers are:

Staying safe & private online	Make profiles private, be careful who you chat to, use appropriate websites
Cyberbullying	On games, chat, messaging, social media, treat everyone with politeness and respect at all times. If cyberbullied, save messages, block, don't reply, speak to a trusted adult, how to report – Childline, CEOP, ThinkUKnow.
Respect	Yourself, each other, other people's work online, don't plagiarise - link instead, don't steal
Mobile Phones	Don't use in school unless told to, keep very safe, PIN protect, don't keep details on it. Register with immobilise.com
Digital Footprint	Remember it can last for years – be careful what you post, where you post things, would you say this to your family, gran etc.?

Plenary:

Write down 'Three ways I can be a good digital citizen'. Discuss with class.
