## Spring - Term 3 Curriculum Overview

### Topic: My World: Knockholt and beyond

#### English

Our key objectives will be:

Met through exploring texts based on our theme of **Knockholt and beyond**.

- Listen to, follow and enjoy a story with a repeating pattern.
- Re-tell a familiar story using sentences.
- Understand that a sentence is a set of words that make sense.
- Write sentences beginning with capital letters and end with a punctuation mark.
- Write narrative and poetry with clear structure and powerful vocabulary
- Recognise and fluently read all phase 3, 4 and 5 sounds and sight words introduced this term.
- To blend to read for meaning, simple phonetically plausible words in sentences, lists and a range of texts.
- To read and spell common exception words and use them correctly in their writing.
- To continue to read for meaning a range of literature and develop confidence to read aloud with fluency, voice modulation and expression.
- **Handwriting:** To correctly form capital letters and all lower case alphabets (Ladder, one armed robot, zig zag and curly caterpillar letters)

Our key objectives will be:

- Add ones using number bonds
- Find and make number bonds to 20
- Doubles

##### Place value for numbers to 20

- Count to 20
- Understand 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19
- Understand 20
- 1 more and 1 less
- The number line to 20
- Use a number line to 20
- Estimate on a number line to 20
- Compare number to 20
- Order numbers to 20

#### P.E.

Our key '**Strength and Flexibility**' objectives will be to develop our understanding how exercise

Developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities

Our key '**Target Games**' objectives will be to:

- To develop underarm throwing towards a target.
- To develop throwing for accuracy.
- To develop underarm and overarm throwing at a target.
- To develop throwing for accuracy and distance using underarm and overarm.
- To select the correct throw for the target.
- To develop throwing for accuracy and distance.

#### Computing

Our key '**Digital Writing**' objectives will help children:

- Explore using individual commands, both with other children and as part of a computer programme.
- Save documents.
- Use the keyboard to create digital writing.

## Geography

Our key **'Our world: Knockholt and beyond'** objectives will be to:

To complete a world map jigsaw.

To identify the continents and oceans of the world.

To know where we live.

To identify human and natural features of the world.

To investigate satellite photos of famous world landmarks.

## PSHE

Our key **'Keeping Safe'** objectives will be to:

- Explain how to keep ourselves safe.
- Recognise and explain how and why sleep is important.
- Understand how medicines help us and the safety surrounding them.
- Recognise how to make correct choices to stay safe.
- Recognise how to share pictures safely.
- Explain our feelings.

## R.E.

Our key learning unit is **'Gospel: What is the good news that Jesus brings?'**

- We will be listening to different stories from the bible and linking them with the idea that Jesus brings good news.
